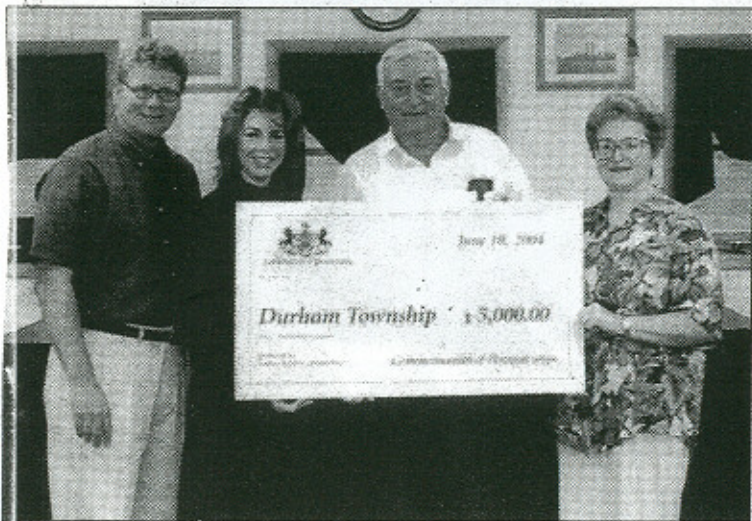


# Wonderling secures grants for upper Bucks programs

Community programs and senior citizens in northern Bucks will receive two grants totaling \$10,000 thanks to the efforts of Sen. Rob Wonderling (R-24).

Wonderling secured the grants through the Department of Community and Economic Development's community revitalization program to enhance community services in the Quakertown area.

A \$5,000 grant was awarded to the Upper Bucks Senior Center to purchase office equipment and supplies to ensure the daily operations of the center and to provide services to area seniors.

"This grant will enable the Upper Bucks Senior Center to purchase a copier, updated computer, fax machine and dig-

ital camera in order to assist AARP with its yearly tax preparation for seniors and also to help launch the center's new website," Wonderling explained.

JustCommunity Inc., the coordinating agency for the Quakertown Area Healthy Communities/Healthy Youth Coalition, was awarded \$5,000 to expand its community accountability circles program.

Wonderling said the objective of the CAC program is to help youth offenders, through the intervention of victims, families and extended support network, to gain a greater understanding of the harm caused by their misdeeds and provide an opportunity for the offenders to take full responsibility for their action.

"JustCommunity Inc. will use the funds to work with the Quakertown Police and Quakertown School District and develop an Advisory Council that will assist youth offenders residing within the school district," Wonderling said.
